What This Bill Does

Establishes national standards for all federal elections:

- Requires paper ballots
 - Mandates same-day, in-person voting
 - Eliminates early voting and unverified mail-in ballots
 - Provides secure absentee voting only for military, disabled, and overseas Americans

The Problem

- Growing public distrust in election security and ballot integrity
- States using inconsistent standards for federal elections
- Vulnerabilities in electronic-only voting systems
- Chain-of-custody issues with unattended drop boxes and mass mail-in voting

- Lack of post-election audits in many jurisdictions

The Solution

All federal elections will follow uniform, transparent standards:

- **Paper ballots only** – the most secure and auditable method
 - **Same-day in-person voting** – restores Election Day as a civic event
 - **No early voting or drop boxes** – protects ballot integrity and chain-of-custody
 - **Strict absentee voting eligibility** – for military, disabled, and overseas citizens only
 - **Mandatory post-election audits** – manual comparison of paper ballots to tabulation results

How It Works

- States transition to secure paper ballot systems for all federal races
- Voting occurs **only on Election Day**, except for tightly controlled absentee voting
- Absentee ballots require strict verification for:
 - Active-duty military & their families
 - Certified disabled voters
 - Overseas American citizens
- Federal grants help states implement the changes by 2028
- Audits are required after every federal election to ensure accuracy
- Voters and candidates have clear legal channels to challenge non-compliance

Why It Matters

This bill:

- Restores faith in elections
- Ensures every legal vote is counted—only once
- Eliminates loopholes exploited by bad actors
- Returns power to citizens, not machines or bureaucracy
- Respects legitimate absentee voting needs without opening the floodgates

 - Grants fund **technology, training, and audit infrastructure**—not bureaucratic expansion

What's Different

- Uniform federal election rules—no more 50 sets of rules for one national race
 - Paper ballots are the official vote record—not machine counts
 - One-day voting enhances civic unity and turnout
 - Voter identification and verification are required for all absentee ballots
 - Audits are **mandatory and transparent**, not optional
 - Strict legal penalties for non-compliance by states or election officials
